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DONG BAN JA MEANS “TO ACCOMPANY”

Terminally ill and dying people, as well as their relatives and loved ones, require special attention. With our intercultural outpatient hospice service Dong Ban Ja, we enable them to live with dignity and self-determination until the very end – taking into account their cultural and migration-related physical, psychological, social, religious, and spiritual needs.

Different customs, cultures, religions, worldviews, and culturally shaped perceptions of illness can lead to misunderstandings in everyday life. This requires sensitive and thoughtful support.

Most of our staff and volunteers have a migrant background themselves and come from different cultural and linguistic contexts. They therefore understand the needs and wishes of sick and dying people and their relatives.

WHAT WE OFFER

- Support for terminally ill and dying people and their families at the end of life.
- Counselling and advice on palliative care, advance directives, and available support services. Support for family members at home, in hospital, or in care facilities. We offer conversations, a listening ear, and assistance with language-related communication barriers.
- Support during the grieving process.

WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT

For those interested in volunteering in intercultural hospice care, we offer regular training courses. Future hospice volunteers engage with topics such as illness, ageing, dying, death, and grief within the context of a diverse, migration-shaped society.
